Teaching in an International Environment



PRESENTATION

This international week will equip future teachers to prepare for a teaching career in a globalized world. As the seat of many European institutions, Strasbourg is the perfect place to study how to teach in an international environment. In a city with a rich intercultural history, we will study what tools educators need to succeed with students from a variety of linguistic and cultural backgrounds.

Founded in the 16th century, the University of Strasbourg has a long history of excellence in higher education. Today, the university welcomes over 52,000 students and over 3,000 researchers. The INSPÉ (Institut national supérieur du professorat et de l'éducation or Faculty of Education & Lifelong Learning) prepares future teachers for careers in education and confers a variety of education degrees.

The participants will attend several classes alongside future French educators who are preparing to take a national certification test to teach French internationally (the CAPEFÉ, Certificat d'Aptitude à participer à l'Enseignement Français à l'Étranger). These joint sessions, taught in English, will focus on topics including interculturality, plurilingualism, translanguaging and teaching in an international environment.

- 🍷 Social activities with French and international students




Practical information

COST

There is no charge to participate in the sessions. Students must cover their travel expenses and accommodations for the week.

ACCOMMODATIONS

Students are responsible for their own lodging and should find availability at the CIARUS or The People Hostel. Students may request to participate in a home stay with a French student, but they cannot be guaranteed for all participants.



TRAVELLING TO STRASBOURG

Strasbourg's central train station is easily accessible from Paris, Frankfurt, Basel, etc. There is also a small airport that is a short 15 minute train ride from the city center. The INSPÉ is accessible via tramway from the train station or the city center.

PREREQUISITES

B1/B2 level in English as the sessions will be offered in English
Notions of French would be beneficial, but are not required

COVID VACCINATION REQUIRED?

It is not currently required for students to be vaccinated against Covid-19 to attend classes. However, a vaccine passport or very recent PCR test is required for entry into public places (museums, restaurants, bars, etc) and PCR tests are no longer free for unvaccinated individuals. Please consult the most recent French public health requirements for international students. Masks must be worn indoors at all times regardless of vaccination status.
