Most of the programme is outdoors. Clothing and shoes suitable for the season and local climate is necessary. The working language is English.

Costs and accommodation

The course is free of charge. Expenses related to travelling, accommodation, food and personal costs are not covered.

About the city of Stavanger

Stavanger city is one of the oldest cities in Norway and settlements here can be traced back 10,000 years. 1125 A.D. marks the start of the building of Stavanger Cathedral, which coincides with Stavanger gaining city status. Today Stavanger is Norway's fourth-largest city, with approximately 146,000 residents.

It offers easy access to the famous Lysefjord, home to renowned natural landmarks like the Pulpit Rock and Kjeragbolten, and the region's famous mile-on-end long beaches along the west coast.

Accessibility is a strength for Stavanger. Its well-connected airport operates numerous daily flights to and from Oslo and several other European destinations.
