


OUTDOOR EDUCATION

The City of Stavanger

Stavanger is one of the oldest cities in Norway, established in 1125. It has approximately 145.000 inhabitants. The surroundings vary from wide-open landscapes with long beaches along the west coast, to steep mountains and fjords on the east.

The University of Stavanger has 12 000 students, consists of 7 faculties, and various research centres. The Institute of Early Childhood Education has 700 students and offers bachelor's, master's, and PhD degrees. For international, English-speaking students we offer a course in comparative educational studies, or an International Week, during the spring semester. We hereby invite you to participate in a week organized around pedagogical aspects related to Outdoor Education.

Norway has a long tradition of using the outdoors and nature as part of the kindergarten and primary school curriculum, and there is a continuous focus on maintaining and developing this tradition. International week in Stavanger offers an introduction to this practise.

PRACTICAL INFORMATION

Certificate

To receive a certificate of attendance (handed out Friday), participation in lectures, activities, and group discussions is mandatory.
